- Show your learner how to open a Facebook page
- Help your learner understand the features of a Facebook page

Remember

- Explain...

- Explain to your learner that you need to join Facebook to set up your own profile. Once you do this you can keep your information private, so that you only share it with friends.
- **Explain** that some companies & clubs like to set up Facebook pages that can be viewed by the public – even if they are not members of Facebook.
- Explain that they are going to explore a • company's public Facebook page
 - **Ask** your learner to open the Internet
- Ask your learner to go to • www.ageaction.ie
- When the homepage opens, ask them to click on the Facebook link
 - Explain the Facebook homepage
 - Log In
 - Wall

• **Explore** the homepage

Exercise

- Go to the photo tab on the Facebook page and browse through one of the Age Action photo albums
- Use the back browser button to go back to the Age Action Facebook homepage
- **Explain** the **Like** and **Comment** buttons on the homepage
- Ask your learner to click on Like What happens?
- Explain that you need to be logged in to Facebook to use the Comment or Like features – but you can still browse the information on a Facebook page without being a member or logged-in
- Ask Your learner to close the internet

If you click on **Like** or **Comment** and are not logged into Facebook, the Facebook sign-up prompt will appear. Close the prompt.

 Show your learner how to open a Twitter 	• Explain that Twitter is a social networking service that allows people to write short messages (called Tweets) to let people	Improver Handout – Social Networking
 Help your learner understand the features of a Twitter page 	 know what they are doing & what they are thinking. Explain that members of Twitter can follow you, if they're interested in what you're doing & that you can follow people, including famous people on Twitter, if you're interested. Explain that once you have followers on Twitter, every time you post a tweet all of your followers will receive it. Similarly, if you follow someone, when they tweet, you will receive it. 	Note: You can send a Tweet to just one person by putting an @ before their Twitter address. This tweet will only be seen by them & anyone who is following both of you

- Explain that you can send a 'private' tweet to a person that only they will see by going to Direct Message on their Twitter page.
- **Explain** that when you join Twitter, you get a Twitter address. Interested parties can type in your Twitter address and look at your profile page to view your Tweets.
- **Explain** that many companies use Twitter to communicate information to hundreds of interested people immediately, rather than sending e-mails etc.

Activity

Browse a Twitter profile page

- Ask your learner to go to <u>www.ageaction.ie</u> and click on the Twitter link on the homepage
- **Explore** the Age Action Twitter homepage
 - o Follow button
 - \circ Tweets
 - Following/Followers
 - Favourites
 - o Sign up

Note: Your Twitter address does not have to be your own name – it could be a 'pen-name'

Tip: Point out the number of people following – they will all receive each Tweet that's posted
